

### Make Ready A People Prepared for the Lord

**Luke 1:17** 

<sup>17</sup> And he shall go before the Lord in the spirit and power of Elias, to turn the hearts of the fathers to the children, and the disobedient to the wisdom of the just, **to make ready a people prepared for the Lord.** 

I welcome you to this year's conference and pray that each of us will be blessed with a great outpouring of His Spirit. In preparing for this year's conference, one thing the Lord kept sharing with me was this Conference cannot just be like any previous conferences. So, as I reviewed the survey of last year's conference and spoke with various people, I began making changes to the schedule and I felt very comfortable in the direction we were heading. However, when the planning committee met, and we were nearly finished with creating the schedule, the Lord spoke so plainly to me and said, "so I get the crumbs?" I knew exactly what He was saying. I felt hurt that that was His feeling. My thought was we would get the necessary business out of the way so we could respond to any direction that He might give. His next response to me was, "so your things are more important than mine?" I asked for prayer to be offered and the spirit rested upon us so heavily that we completely changed the agenda to what is before you now. That night, I was so filled with the spirit, I couldn't sleep at 1:00 a.m., I went out to my living room, sat in the dark and prayed. There was a word that was pressing very heavily upon me. As I pondered on that, the Lord took me to D&C Section 1 and I realized that the 1<sup>st</sup> word in the D&C was hearken. In that spirit, I read each verse and the Lord laid before me the focus that we need to have on a daily basis of the conference. I say focus and not themes because I believe themes is not the depth that the Lord is looking for in this conference. This year other than the quorum sessions everyone is welcome and encouraged to attend all sessions. The business session will also be open for everyone, however only the elders will be voting. It is my prayer that each of us come together and listen for His spirit to give us guidance and direction and that we can also not only prepare ourselves but be prepared to prepare others to meet the Lord.

- Hearken...The voice of the Lord is unto all... Hearken: Listen with the intent to obey. (D&C Section 1:1)
  - 1a. Hearken, O ye people of my church, saith the voice of him who dwells on high, and whose eyes are upon all men; yea, verily I say, Hearken ye people from afar, and ye that are upon the islands of the sea, listen together;
  - 1b. for verily the voice of the Lord is unto all men, and there is none to escape, and there is no eye that shall not see, neither ear that shall not hear, neither heart that shall not be penetrated;

1c. and the rebellious shall be pierced with much sorrow, for their iniquities shall be spoken upon the housetops, and their secret acts shall be revealed;

1d. and the voice of warning shall be unto all people, by the mouths of my disciples, whom I have chosen in these last days, and they shall go forth and none shall stay them, for I the Lord have commanded them.

Monday:

- The Authority of My servants...

(D&C Section1:2)

2a. Behold, this is mine authority, and the authority of my servants, and my preface unto the book of my commandments, which I have given them to publish unto you, O inhabitants of the earth;

2b. wherefore fear and tremble, O ye people, for what I the Lord have decreed, in them, shall be fulfilled.

2c. And verily, I say unto you, that they who go forth, bearing these tidings unto the inhabitants of the earth, to them is power given to seal, both on earth and in heaven, the unbelieving and rebellious;

2d. yea, verily, to seal them up unto the day when the wrath of God shall be poured out upon the wicked without measure;

2e. unto the day when the Lord shall come to recompense unto every man according to his work, and measure to every man according to the measure which he has measured to his fellow-man.

Tuesday:

- Prepare ye prepare ye for that which is to come...

(D&C Section 1:3)

3a. Wherefore the voice of the Lord is unto the ends of the earth, that all that will hear may hear;

3b. prepare ye, prepare ye for that which is to come, for the Lord is nigh; and the anger of the Lord is kindled, and his sword is bathed in heaven, and it shall fall upon the inhabitants of the earth; and the arm of the Lord shall be revealed;

3c. and the day cometh that they who will not hear the voice of the Lord, neither the voice of his servants, neither give heed to the words of the prophets and apostles, shall be cut off from among the people;

3d. for they have strayed from mine ordinances, and have broken mine everlasting covenant; they seek not the Lord to establish his righteousness,

3e. but every man walketh in his own way, and after the image of his own god, whose image is in the likeness of the world, and whose substance is that of an idol, which waxeth old and shall perish in Babylon, even Babylon the great, which shall fall.

**Luke 1:17** 

Wednesday:- They should proclaim these things unto the world...

(D&C Section 1:4)

4a. Wherefore I the Lord, knowing the calamity which should come upon the inhabitants of the earth, called upon my servant Joseph Smith, Jr., and spake unto him from heaven, and gave him commandments, and also gave commandments to others, that they should proclaim these things unto the world;

4b. and all this that it might be fulfilled, which was written by the prophets;

4c. the weak things of the world shall come forth and break down the mighty and strong ones, that man should not counsel his fellow-man, neither trust in the arm of flesh, but that every man might speak in the name of God the Lord, even the Savior of the world;

4d. that faith also might increase in the earth; that mine everlasting covenant might be established;

4e. that the fullness of my gospel might be proclaimed by the weak and the simple, unto the ends of the world, and before kings and rulers.

**Thursday:** - That they might come to understanding...

(D&C Section 1:5)

5a. Behold, I am God, and have spoken it; these commandments are of me, and were given unto my servants in their weakness, after the manner of their language, that they might come to understanding;

5b. and inasmuch as they erred it might be made known; and inasmuch as they sought wisdom they might be instructed;

5c. and inasmuch as they sinned they might be chastened, that they might repent; and inasmuch as they were humble, they might be made strong, and blessed from on high, and receive knowledge from time to time;

5d. and after having received the record of the Nephites, yea, even my servant Joseph Smith, Jr., might have power to translate, through the mercy of God, by the power of God, the Book of Mormon;

5e. and also those to whom these commandments were given might have power to lay the foundation of this church, and to bring it forth out of obscurity, and out of darkness, the only true and living church upon the face of the whole earth, with which I the Lord am well pleased, speaking unto the church collectively and not individually;

5f. for I the Lord cannot look upon sin with the least degree of allowance; nevertheless, he that repents and does the commandments of the Lord shall be forgiven;

5g. and he that repents not, from him shall be taken even the light which he has received, for my Spirit shall not always strive with man, saith the Lord of Hosts.


### **Parking**

# 2024 Conference of Restoration Elders Melchizedec Credentials Guidelines

Amended April 6, 2010

The following guidelines will serve as the basis for seating all elders in the current assembly and in other CRE activities, and continue in effect unless, or until altered through future conference action.

Participation in the Elders Conference shall be extended to authoritatively ordained Melchisedec Priesthood—

- 1. Who, currently function within a "Restoration Branch," and whose office and ordination have been determined to be in order by the Credentials Committee of said conference, or the Coordinating Council between conferences. (A "Restoration Branch" does not accept such doctrines as the ordination of women to the priesthood, the serving of the sacrament to persons without authoritative baptisms, or participate or accept the calling and ordination of men to priesthood offices other than elder, priest, teacher, or deacon. Any branch previously engaged or associated with an organization which participated in such actions are required to renounce the same in order to be considered and function as a "Restoration Branch.")
- **2. Who,** while not joined with a branch, have remained faithful to their calling by supporting the "Restoration Position," and whose office and ordination have been determined to be in order by the Credentials Committee of said conference, or the Coordinating Council between conferences.
- **3. Who,** for reasons of conscience or physical location have continued to minister within the framework of the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints/Community of Christ, but who have not subscribed to, nor participated in any divergent practices or doctrines, and whose office and ordination have been determined to be in order by the Credentials Committee of said conference, or the Coordinating Council between conferences.
- **4. Who** have since then been affiliated with one or more of the factional movements—who are willing to renounce said affiliation and repent of any participation in divergent practices or doctrines including, but not limited to the rejection of any subsequent ordinations, whose office and ordination have been determined to be in order by the Credentials Committee of said conference, or the Coordinating Council between conferences.
- **5. Who,** by accepting a call to the priesthood, have accepted the personal responsibility of maintaining the highest standards of Christian conduct. Verified failure to maintain such standards may constitute grounds for denying or revoking one's right to voice, vote, and participation in CRE activities.

—Upon the written statements of two or more credible witnesses to conduct on the part of a Melchisedec priesthood member that is unbecoming a priesthood member, or conduct that is detrimental to that members' ministry, or the ministry of others, the Credentials Committee, or Coordinating Council between conferences, will determine whether said priesthood member is eligible to participate in the Conference of Restoration Elders.

# 2024 Conference of Restoration Elders Melchizedec Credentials Guidelines, *Cont'd*.

Amended April 6, 2010

Circumstances or questions concerning eligibility of a Melchisedec priesthood member to be seated in the CRE that may arise that are not covered by any of the above guidelines will be reviewed and acted upon by the Credentials Committee on a case-by-case basis.

Appeals of the decision of the Credentials Committee for seating shall be made in writing and submitted to the CRE Coordinating Council for review, consideration, and action. If the appeal is denied, and one of the parties involved desires to appeal the decision of the Coordinating Council, a committee of seven Elders shall be elected from the seated body of elders in conference to review and consider the appeal. The elected representatives will consider the appeal during the convening conference and render a decision that shall be final for that conference. In this way, the rights of the individual and the rights of the body to consider matters pertaining to the conference will be preserved and protected.

### **PARLIAMENTARY GUIDELINES**

### **BASIC PRINCIPLES**

Only one matter shall be considered at a time (keep it clear)

No one can speak until recognized by the presiding officer.

No one can speak a second time, on the same issue, as long as another wants to speak for the first time.

The presiding officer should try to alternately recognize speakers with opposing points view. Each group should have a Constitution and bylaws that specifies the quorum and any modifications of basic parliamentary procedure.

### **MOTION vs RESOLUTIONS**

A main motion is an actionable matter, which specifies what the group will do in the future. A resolution is a formal statement of opinion about a matter outside the jurisdiction of the

### **AMENDMENTS**

group.

Amendments should be "relevant" but can also contradict the "intent" of the main motion or resolution.

Only two amendments can be on the floor at the same time: one to amend the main motion or resolution and one to amend the amendment. Additional amendments must wait until at least one of the two is disposed of.

Amendments should be voted on before the main motion or resolution is voted on. If an amendment is tabled or postponed, the applicable main motion or resolution should be tabled or postponed.

### **VOTING PROCEDURES**

Methods of voting: vocal (aye or nay), showing hands, standing, roll call or secret ballot.

The method of voting may be specified in the bylaws or chosen by the presiding officer. A group may overturn the bylaws method by a 2/3 vote on a main motion that specifies a different method, or it may overturn the choice of the presiding officer by a majority vote on such a motion.

Abstentions are group members present at a meeting but not voting, and abstentions do not affect voting. E.g., In a group of 1,000 members: 2 in favor, 1 opposed and 997 abstentions would be both a majority and 2/3 vote for the matter voted on. The presiding officer, if a member of the group, can vote at any time if the bylaws don't specify otherwise. The presiding officer can vote to break ties, or to create ties (and thus defeat a motion). If not a member of the group, the presiding officer should not vote at any time.

To stop debate and proceed to the voting, a group can pass the "previous question" (2/3 vote), or a member of the group can "call the question" (unanimous consent of the group), or the presiding officer can ask for a vote (also unanimous consent of the group).

### **APPEALS**

Decisions of the presiding officer are limited by the will of the group. Any "Chair" decision may be overturned by "appealing the decision of the chair." The majority vote determines the decision, even if some members of the group disagree.

### **INFORMALITY**

Formal procedures require a motion or resolution, properly made and seconded, before debate begins on the issue. Some informal groups discuss the topic first, and the motion or resolution is formulated during discussion. The presiding officer should allow debate, amendments, etc., in both procedures.

### **HOW TO MAKE MOTIONS**

1)	"I move that"
2)	"I object to the consideration of this motion." (Must be BEFORE ANY DEBATE. YOU DO NOT NEED TO BE RECOGNIZED BY THE CHAIR.)
3)	"I move that we postpone this matter indefinitely." (A motion to kill.)

### **Proposed Changes to the Melchisedec Credentials Guidelines**

**Whereas,** at the 2023 Conference of Restoration Elders discussed changes to the Melchisedec Credential Guidelines,

And whereas, they unable to reach consensus,

**And whereas,** they referred the proposed changes to the Coordinating Council to bring back their recommendation.

**Be it resolved** that through prayer and discussion the Coordinating Council resubmits the proposed changes as it was submitted at the 2023 conference with the exception of one correction in the first paragraph changing "activities" to "conferences".

### **Proposed Changes to the Melchisedec Credentials Guidelines**

Previously Amended April 6, 2010, offered by the Coordinating Council

Whereas, the current Melchisedec Credentials Guidelines have not been reviewed for the past 13 years,

**And whereas,** the Lord spoke to His priesthood at Kirtland in September 24, 2022, to be willing to remove all barriers and hinderances to the achievement of Zion,

**And whereas,** it is individuals who make up the body of the Conference of Restoration Elders rather than the branches,

**Be it resolved** that the Melchisedec Credential Guidelines represent the direction in which the Lord has desired we take in removing barrier and hinderances to the work of the Conference of Restoration Elders,

**And be it further resolved** that these new guidelines be adopted by the vote of the Elders Conference and published as outlined below.

The following guidelines will serve as the basis for seating all elders in the current assembly and in other CRE activities conferences, and continue in effect unless, or until altered through future conference action.

Participation in the Elders Conference shall be extended to authoritatively ordained Melchisedec Priesthood—

1. Whose, currently function within a "Restoration Branch," and whose office and ordination have been determined to be in order by the Credentials Committee of said conference, or the Coordinating

### **Proposed Changes to the Melchisedec Credentials Guidelines**

Council between conferences. (A "Restoration Branch Said elder does not accept such doctrines as the ordination of women to the priesthood, the serving of the sacrament to persons without authoritative baptisms or participate or accept the calling and ordination of men to the priesthood offices other than elder, priest, teacher, or deacon. Any branch previously engaged, or associated with an organization which participated in such actions are required to renounce the same to be considered and function as a "Restoration Branch." Any Elder which participated in such actions are required to renounce the same as a credentialed elder.

- 2. **Who,** while not joined with a branch, have remained faithful to their calling by supporting the "Restoration Position," and whose office and calling have been determined to be in order by the Credentials Committee of said conference, or the Coordinating Council between the conferences.
- 3. Who, for reasons of conscience or physical location have continued to minister within the framework of the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints/Community of Christ, but who have not subscribed to, nor participated in any divergent practices or doctrines, and whose office and ordination have been determined to be in order by the Credentials Committee of said conference, or the Coordinating Council between conferences.
- 4. Who, have since been affiliated with one or more of the factional movements—who are willing to renounce said affiliations and repent of any participation in divergent practices or doctrines. including but not limited to the rejection of any subsequent ordinations, whose office and ordination have been determined to be in order by the Credential Committee of said conference, or the Coordinating Council between conferences.
- 5. **Who,** by accepting a call to the priesthood, have accepted the personal responsibility of maintaining the highest standards of Christian conduct. Verified failure to maintain such standards may constitute grounds for denying or revoking one's right to voice, vote, and participation in CRE activities the Elders Conference.
  - a. Upon the written verification of two or more credible witnesses to conduct on the part of the Melchisedec priesthood member that is unbecoming a priesthood member, or conduct that is determined to that member's ministry, or the ministry of others, the Credentials Committee, or Coordinating Council between conferences, will determine whether said priesthood member is eligible to participate in the Conference of Restoration Elders.

### Proposed Resolution #1, Cont'd.

### **Proposed Changes to the Melchisedec Credentials Guidelines**

Circumstances or questions concerning the eligibility of a Melchisedec priesthood member to be seated in the Elders Conference that may arise that are not covered by any of the above guidelines will be reviewed and acted upon by the Credentials Committee on a case-by-case basis.

Appeals of the decision of the Credentials Committee for seating shall be made in writing and submitted to the Coordinating Council of the Conference of Restoration Elders for review, consideration, and action. If the appeal is denied, and one of the parties involved desires to appeal the decision of the Coordinating Council, a committee of seven elders shall be elected from the seated body of elders in conference to review and consider the appeal. The elected representatives will consider the appeal during the convening conference and render a decision that shall be final for the conference will be preserved and protected.

### **Proposed Resolution #2**

### **Assistant Treasurer**

By: Conference Treasurer

Whereas the financial accounting for the conference continues to grow and whereas with a volunteer army labor and time is limited and whereas this will probably be the last year for the current treasurer.

**Therefore, be it resolved** that an assistant treasurer be elected at this conference and all future conferences.

**Be it resolved** that the assistant treasurer has full authority as the treasurer in the absence of or the need of the treasurer.

### **Proposed Resolution #3**

### **Technology**

By the Coordinating Council

Resolution to Establish a Technology Council for the Conference of Restoration Elders:

Whereas the integration of technology is becoming increasingly important for enhancing the operations and outreach of our church community.

Whereas there is a need for a structured approach to assess, implement, and optimize technology solutions within our church.

**Therefore, be it resolved** that the Conference of Restoration Elders establish a Technology Council with the following objectives:

- 1. To assess the current state of technology infrastructure within the Conference of Restoration Elders and identify areas for improvement.
- 2. To research and recommend technology solutions that enhance communication, community engagement, and outreach efforts.
- 3. To collaborate with various councils within the Conference of Restoration Elders to establish effective implementation of technology tools.
- 4. To evaluate the ongoing impact of technology on Restoration Church operations, communication, and outreach initiatives.

The Technology Committee will consist of representatives of various stakeholder groups such as, branch leaders, IT specialists, and members with interest in technology, to ensure a comprehensive ongoing perspective. The council should be made up of at least five members but no more than seven members. This resolution is effective immediately upon approval, and the committee shall convene regular meetings to address the outlined objectives.

# Women's Council

Whereas the Women's Council desires to promote harmony with past practices and would like to prevent further confusion, we recommend the following guidelines for the Women's Council:

**Be it revolved** that the size of the Women's Council be limited to 7 members unless the Council determines more help is needed to accomplish the work and requests an increase in the number of members.

Prior to Conference the Council Chair shall inform the Conference Chairman of the names the Council would like to nominate to fill the open positions.

# **Domestic Missionary and Outreach Council**



Left KC on Oct 25th and stayed the night in Laramie, Wyoming. 26th drove to Ogden, UT. I had two families in Ogden to find. One family not at home. The other family, the husband had passed away. The wife remarried and now goes to a Presbyterian church, and I could not find the other family. Left Ogden, UT and went to Hebet, UT where I stayed the night at a cousin's home. Had a good visit, much pertaining to the Gospel as they are LDS. Left the next morning and looked up an attorney that his name was on my list that subscribed to the Tidings of Zion. He was not interested in the Gospel. He was a history buff and just wanted to keep up with what was happening in the Restoration. He actually belonged to the LDS. One other person had moved. I left Salt Lake and went to Elko, Nevada. Had three people to find there. All of these people I had addresses for but no telephone numbers. First family had sold their home 27 yrs. ago. The other two were working and were not at home. I got their cell phone numbers from the next-door neighbors. I called them, but they did not answer or return my calls. Stayed the night at Motel 6, and left the next morning for Sparks, NV. Had three people in Sparks to find. One was on vacation. No one home at the other two. Left Sparks on Saturday at approximately 1:00 p.m. and drove to Reno, NV. Went to a home south of Carson City. Dog was at home but no one else. At each home that the people were not at home, I left information where I could be reached. No responses. Saturday afternoon late I drove to Susanville, California to visit another cousin. Many years ago, she was ex-communicated from LDS church. Had a great visit, but no progress with the gospel of Christ. Sunday the 29<sup>th</sup> I left Susanville, CA to go to St. George, UT. I had to go through Sparks, NV, and I stopped to see if anyone was now at home. They were not. That night, I stayed at Mesquite, NV. The next morning, I

travelled to St. George, UT. I visited another cousin that had recently lost her husband, and I was able to provide some Bereavement Ministry there. The night of the 30<sup>th</sup> I went back to Mesquite, NV for the night as the hotel was only \$40.00 a night. I then went to Las Vegas. I had three people to find. The first one was an attorney that had his office in a gated community. The person at the gate called him to get permission for me to see him. Said he was too busy to see me and wouldn't give me his phone number. One of the others was not home and I couldn't find the address for the other. Left Las Vegas on Tuesday and drove to Casa Grande, AZ. My nephew and his wife were very receptive to hear the Gospel story. My nephew was baptized in the RLDS church when he was a young boy. I was in Casa Grande, AZ for 6 days. While there, I made a visit to a businessman that I was acquainted with. While talking with him, he said he was to have an operation on the 14th of November. We talked about administration, and I asked if he would want to receive a blessing of the laying on of hands. He agreed, and I performed the ordinance. When I mentioned the ordinance of anointing with oil, I told him it was in James 5. He got his Bible out and immediately turned to James 5 and read it. He already knew about the anointing. He is a very good Baptist but had somewhat of an open mind. I will follow up on his operation. I left Casa Grande on Monday to go to Estes Park, CO. I had contacted a lady that as a RLDS member but has not had contact with the church for several years. I arrived on Wednesday evening the 8<sup>th</sup> of November. I served communion to her and her husband. Her husband had been baptized by an Elder that I had great respect for, so I had no problem serving him the emblems. Had great conversations about the Gospel and what the church is today. Stayed the night and left for KC this morning. I travelled approximately 5,000 miles overall, and the trip was a success. Disappointing in some way, and fantastic in other ways. I learned a long time ago three things that God is not concerned with: time, distance, and money. With God, there is no time. There is no distance to him, and he has control of all the money in this world, one way or another.

#### Region 3: North Central (Incl. Canada)

This was the first full year for me in this domestic region beginning with the first area conference in Michigan of restoration branch saints and priesthood which met after the CRE conference in April 2023. At that conference a very good cross section of saints participated and furthered my acquaintances. In total I was in and out of this region five more times in the summer and fall of 2023 sometimes for a week or more in extended stays. This was facilitated by accommodations,

meals, and transportation. By Tom and Janine Essensmacher of Gladwin, Michigan, and Jay and Kathi Havener of Oxford, Michigan. These two outstanding homes made excellent working centers for traveling. These couples have extended contacts and information of the scattered saints, the restoration branches, and missions in this area. In particular, Elder Tom Essenmacher has become an invaluable appendage to my traveling ministry, invaluable in meeting and worshipping with the saints through Michigan and Canada.



I have worshipped with saints from the branches in the Atlanta Northern Michigan, Charlotte, Oakwood, Saint John's, and Traverse City areas as well as a visit to worship with saints in Canada adjacent to the Detroit area. In addition, I have traveled with several elders to visit some shut-in saints. I also attended the Maine and Tempe Grove reunions

where many of the saints from these areas were in attendance and was able to have further fellowship in those locations. In the longest trip which included the reunions and several trips into Michigan I drove over 6,000 miles for ministry. In November, in route home from the Philippines, I was able to fly first to Michigan to share with several saints the good news taking place overseas. Other ministry and contacts have been accomplished online and by e-mail.

#### Prospects and challenges for 2024 include:

- 1. Training of a new young missionary, Caleb Pickett from my Outreach branch, in traveling ministry beginning with the area conference in Michigan this spring. Part of his first responsibilities will be coordinating the update of an area directory from the information submitted from area elders and CRE resources for missionary use.
- 2. Further endeavors to reach the branches and scattered saints in all areas but particularly in Eckerman, where priesthood leadership has dwindled, Atlanta where Harry Hyde is the sole resident elder for most of upper northern Michigan, in Wisconsin where saints have had little visiting ministry, as well as ministry to the scattered saints in central Canada, worshipping more with branches north of Detroit, and trips to adjoining states of the Dakotas, etc. Planning will begin with many of the Great Lakes area elders at the CRE conference and the Michigan area conference in the spring.

#### Region 3: North Central (Incl. Canada), Cont'd.

- 3 Constraints and challenges are the vast distances between saints and branches and the distant from Independence where I reside and region 3, and the cost of travel even though most lodging and meals are provided by the saints. All of the Domestic Outreach budgetary funds allotted to Region 3 were expended quickly almost entirely on fuel and other transportation. Increased funds are requested for the next year. No local area full-time missionaries have been secured and funds for that purpose set aside for Michigan from the 2023 conference were mostly unused.
- 4. Consistent prayer and a spirit of priesthood cooperation is needed in addressing the many needs of this once populous area of the restoration including reaching out to COC saints whose branches have dwindled or shut down, scattered elderly saints who do not travel to distant local beaches, and work with other ministers in other restoration factions/groups. In addition, a cooperative youth program is needed as this was a strong feature of the Great Lakes restoration saints and a prerequisite for future stability of growth of the great lake branches.

# Region 4: Nebraska, Iowa, Illinois, Outstate Missouri (Excl. Center Place) / Midwest Activities By: Dale Stafford

Since the last conference, we have made some progress towards providing ministry in my assigned areas. In Iowa I have provided the following ministry to the area. At the Des Moines congregation I have provided speakers for the 4th Sunday of each month. Also in Iowa, I attended the Council Bluffs retreat and got acquainted with some of the saints in that area. Tom Mitchell and Aaron Smith provided the ministry for the weekend. I also attended the Woodbine Reunion in Iowa in August and taught the adult class during the reunion, which went well.

I didn't accomplish much in Nebraska. I tried to contact all the branches on my list when I started my term but didn't' receive much of a response. In Missouri the past year, I was able to provide ministry in Columbia, Carthage, and the Maysville congregations. Also, our congregation provides a speaker every other month to the Butler Restoration Branch.

In Illinois I have been successful in Aurora-Chicago congregation. However, they are meeting in the home of the Gooding family located in Chanoa, Illinois. I served sacrament and the spoken word Easter weekend last year. Elder Danny Goold and I returned February 10th and 11th, we served communion, blessed two children, and administered to a 3-year-old who is recovering from cancer. We also were asked to comeback in May or June to conduct a baptism service for Jackson Gooding (13-year-old) who asked us if he could be baptized while we were there.

I never received any of that information from any branch.

**Region 6: South-Central**

The work is continuing to be supported in the South-Central region with very limited locations at this time. Priesthood from the center-place travel regularly to the town of Miami, OK and provide teaching and preaching ministry on a regular basis. Miami has two elders who are able to provide some standing ministry, however, distance and work schedules limit their ability to cover every Sunday each month.

One recent development is the effort to find a way to engage the Remnant groups in Sperry, OK and also in Carthage, MO. Nigeria: We have been unable to travel from the US into Nigeria for the last 4 years because of government warnings. However, brother Dayo did travel to Rwanda and meet 2 missionaries from the US last July. Previously 2 Elders from Kenya traveled to Nigeria to provide ministry.

A pulpit exchange annually in Nigeria gives the opportunity for the saints to receive ministry from priesthood of other branches.

A Teacher was ordained in Lagos and 15 new members were baptized.

Branch at Abakali, Eboniyi State Southeast Nigeria, 11 new members baptized, Elder ordained.

New Branch at Umunede, Delta State, South Nigeria, 22 baptized, Elder ordained.

Women had their retreat in Port Harcourt in September. Youth will have a retreat in Umuahia. Mission work will be carried out at Mbaise branch in Imo State, Southeast Nigeria. Oblation was sent to Nigeria for heavy flooding, burned out village, several hospital stays.

Prayers are urgently needed for Dayo's branch in Lagos. The government has issued a land use law that property used for a residence cannot be used for a church. Dayo's branch of 18 years will have to vacate the church on his mother's property and find a place to rent until the Restoration Campground can be completed far enough to have meetings.

# Local Kenya Report The Church in Kenya

It has been a fruitful year for the church in Kenya. The body continued to grow in both numbers and strength. The Lord has continued to be faithful to us. We continued to witness increase in membership and branches in the year 2023/2024. The church has continued to expand in the western side of Kenya and also the coastal region. New missions are arising and the relatively older ones turning into branches. Some of the forums for spreading the gospel have turned out to be unusual places like funeral services conducted by the church for family.

#### The Church in the Coastal Region of the Indian Ocean

The work has extended to new areas especially in the coastal region of the Indian Ocean which has strong Islamic influence. The two branches at the Technical University of Mombasa and the Port Reitz Medical Training College campuses in Mombasa city continues to grow in strength and numbers. They both have

priesthood in charge and have great potential for growth. It is exciting and encouraging to see young men and women of college ages involved in the work of the gospel of the Kingdom of God. The work that started there a few years ago has spread beyond the coastal town of Mombasa to Ramisi and Msambweni in Kwale County. Of particular importance is the excitement with which the gospel is growing in this region. In the month of December last year Elders Brian Mundy, Fred Brown, and a local priesthood member Elder Eliud Okecha labored in the region and the Lord brought good harvest in numbers baptized into the church. Later the local priesthood visited the area again and additional members were added to the church by baptism. Kwale now has 30 baptized members and



a priest in charge of the congregation. Msambweni is just beginning and is expected to grow within the year. There is an invitation to take the gospel to Lunga Lunga by the Kenya Tanzania border at the coast. Three of the men from that area attended the series taught by the missionaries in December and have expressed interest in the gospel for their area. Another area within that region is called Kilifi County where we have two baptized members.

#### **Local Uganda Report**

Am glad to inform you that the Lord's work here in Uganda is moving on well and right now the church of Christ here has missions in Bulambuli, Mayuge, Kadebede, and Busiu with 2 branches fully established in Bumageni, and Entebbe.

Bumageni has 84 members and Kampala has 10 members. There are missions with baptisms like Mayuge with 6 baptisms, Bulambuli had 1 baptism, and Kadebede had 2 baptisms.

Five ministers go out and share the gospel to all these places and they do this either once or twice a month or more than that according to the needs of the place and financial support from the church.

We expect to have more missions doubling the ones we have by October 2025.

We also expect to be traveling more than before and we therefore expect to have more expenses for traveling and other needs in these branches as well as missions.

Due to an increase in the number of youths we plan to begin holding youth camps locally in order to increase their awareness about the church and its doctrine. Not only youths but also priesthoods and women camps are expected to be held beginning this year.

Uniting the church has always been our prayer and now activities that unite the church locally, national, and globally are going to be conducted like camps, and projects among a few have been started.

To have independence we have secure a piece of land for every branch as well as a building for worship for each branch for easy identification. Also, we hope to establish national headquarters being Bumageni and have a number of infrastructures for easy accommodations during camps, activities among others.

There are 9 priesthood members in Uganda: 4 Elders, 2 Priests, 1 Teacher and 2 Deacons.

There are 103 baptized and confirmed members in Uganda.

Of course, the above and others that come are intended at spreading the gospel of the Kingdom to all parts of the country and worldwide.

We therefore request that you always keep us in prayer.

#### **Urgent Need**

The region is a high potential field. The distance between Kisumu where many of the church members are located to Mombasa is about 516 miles and takes slightly over 12 hours traveling by road. With the local traveling conditions this is not easy to cover, making the visits by the local priesthood irregular and

costly. There is an urgent need to have a dedicated ministry that can focus efforts and attention to the region. There is therefore a need for the conference to consider providing resources to facilitate a missionary or missionary couples who can spend one or two months in the area from time to time, as a response to the interest and response witnessed from the locals.

#### **Kenya Restoration Youth Ministry**

Most of our youths leave home for high school education in boarding schools. This means a good number of them are home with the family and the home branches between the time they are born to when they reach the 8<sup>th</sup> grade. After this a good number join boarding schools with the remaining attending day schools. Those attending colleges are usually in the cities and away from home. This poses challenges with nurturing them in the ways of the Kingdom, especially those who end up in the towns or cities where we do not have church presence.

#### The Kenya Restoration Youth Council

Kenya like most of the developing countries has a young population. In the year the youths organized themselves and elected the Kenya Restoration Youth Council. This office has been busy working with the local church leadership to bring ministry to the youths and the national church as a whole. This has been one of the best works of The Lord during the year. We have both witnessed and benefitted from the good fruits of the labors of this leadership. They are very motivated and serve with clear purpose to be good witnesses of The Lord Jesus.

During the year we conducted a number of retreats for the church youths. Elder Aaron Smith and his wife April from Oak Grove Restoration Branch accompanied by two youths Miss Emma Turner from Missionary Restoration Branch and Jacob Presler from South Crysler Restoration Branch, joined the resident missionaries Doug and Judi Smith and the local priesthood to bring ministry to the college students. This was very blessed by the Lord, and we praise his name. Earlier in the year we had also held another blessed retreat for the high school youths. The teachers included sisters Kara Smith and Alissa Witherell from the US and Doug and Judi Smith from Kenya.

Besides these we have a number of retreats to both strengthen the youth and train those in priesthood and those with potential for priesthood and leadership. These are usually very well attended, always beyond our estimates of attendance. The youth ministry is spreading the gospel to regions and tribes that are not yet represent in the church by baptism. It is very encouraging to witness our youths fully engaged in the work of the gospel and working alongside the adults in the ministry. The future of the church is bright.

## Mildred Smith Mission Health Center Report – Awasi, Kenya

God has surely blessed the work we are doing at the Mildred Smith Mission health Center. Every day before we open the clinic, we thank the Lord for those who have sacrificed to make these facilities

available to the people here. This year has been a year of growth, with over 500 active patients on our panel now. These are patients who are returning for not just acute illness, but continuing wellness and prevention services. At the end of every visit, time is made available to pray with each patient for their physical and spiritual healing.



Our screening programs for glaucoma and cancers have all been bearing fruit. In Kenya, the number one cause of cancer death is cervical cancer. We were able to purchase the machine to do HPV (Human Papilloma Virus) screening for early detection of cervical cancer. This year we have added a video colposcope and a thermal ablation device so that the cancer can be diagnosed in the office and precancerous lesions can be treated immediately. We are the sole provider of this service on the western side of Kenya. We have initiated breast self-exam training for all of our female patients of appropriate age for breast cancer awareness and have done presentations at the women's retreats and surrounding hospitals about cancer awareness.



Our laboratory continues to be the referral lab for government and private clinics and hospitals all around us, due to our commitment to reliable results through maintenance of our equipment and keeping reagents in stock. Besides offering the best medical care, we also do wellness counseling based directly on the Lord's revelation for our temporal salvation, the Word of Wisdom.

The drilling of the well has been finished, and we are now working on getting our water tower built which will enable

distributing the water not only for our needs but also for the Attenzion school, and even for those in the surrounding community.

More and more we have been impressed with the need to have inpatient services. Weekly, we see patients return to their homes when we would prefer to observe them longer and make sure they get

the proper care and medication. We also refer them to other hospitals, but we have found it is quite possible the hospitals will send them home too early and don't do adequate care or diagnosis. There is also a need for good prenatal care with labor and delivery services, so we are trusting in God's direction towards building a facility that would enable us to serve in that way even as soon as this year. Of course, time is always a challenge, but the great thing about challenges here is seeing how the Lord will overcome them! Thank you for your continued prayers as we move forward in this endeavor.


